# Successful approaches to prevent and tackle undeclared work



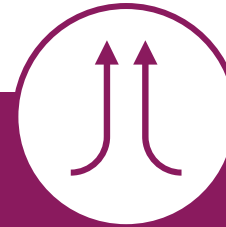
Collaboration to ensure the main players act together



A risk-based approach to focus resources on the areas of greatest need



Prevention - stopping the problem arising in the first place



Taking a holistic approach using a range of measures in parallel

# Lessons learned

- Good cooperation between social partners and enforcement authorities is vital
- Trusted relationship with workers and/or companies
- Valuable sector-specific knowledge, enabling early warnings on new developments and innovative actions
- Importance of cross-border knowledge sharing
